



Taft Avenue Sewer Improvement Project

OC San is upgrading nearly two miles of regional sewer pipeline along Taft Ave. in the City of Orange to increase the size from 12–15 inches to 18–21 inches. This will improve long-term reliability for the community.

Construction is ongoing in the center median of Taft Ave. Lane closures and parking restrictions are necessary to allow enough space for installation of the new sewer pipe while maintaining service for the community. We truly appreciate your patience and understanding as we enhance this essential infrastructure.

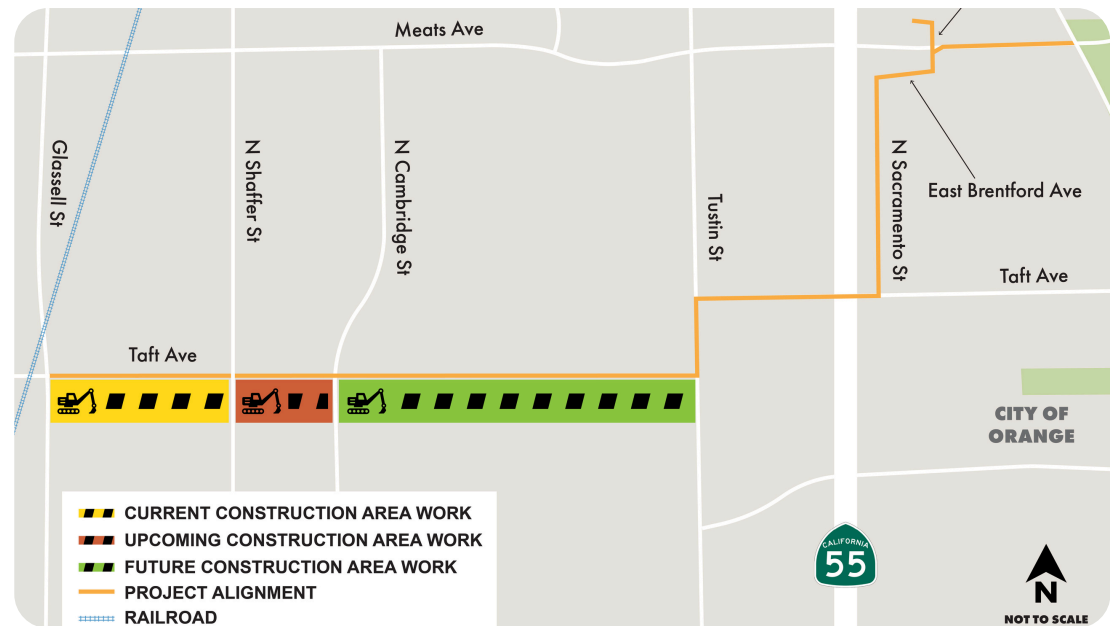
Location: On Taft Ave. as shown on map.
