



Cypress Trunk Sewer Project

Construction Headed Your Way!

As part of the **Cypress Trunk Sewer Project**, we're continuing important improvements to the regional sewer system serving your community. Crews will soon begin work on Orange Ave. to replace a section of sewer pipe and extend the life of the system for years to come. In order to maintain uninterrupted service during construction, a full closure is needed to install a temporary bypass system to reroute flow. After the bypass is in place, crews will excavate the work area and place the new section of pipe.

Location: Orange Ave. at Alderbury St.

When: Starting Tuesday, February 17, – late March*

Work Hours: Mon. – Sat., 7 a.m. – 7 p.m.*

Crews will be working extended hours and days to shorten the overall duration of the work.

What to Expect:

- Access to the neighborhood will be closed at Alderbury St. and Orange Ave (see the red area on the map). Please use Newman Ave. and follow all posted signs.
- Reduced lanes along Orange Ave—left turns will be limited to and from Julie Beth St.
- Crosswalks and bike lanes will be closed until work is completed.
- Permanent traffic control will remain in place throughout the duration of work.
- Increased activity, dust, and noise levels

The Project

The Cypress Trunk Sewer Project is enhancing 7 miles of regional sewer through various streets in the cities of Cypress, La Palma, and Los Alamitos. A mile of pipe will be replaced with a larger diameter pipe to increase the capacity, approximately 5.5 miles of pipe will be cleaned and injected with chemical grout to lengthen its service life, and approximately 100 manholes will also be replaced and/or rehabilitated.

The Need

The Cypress Trunk Sewer Project will ensure the continued reliability of the regional sewer system. The regional sewer line in the cities of Cypress, Los Alamitos, and La Palma is approximately 50 years old and in need of upgrades. These repairs will increase sewer capacity and allow for more efficient and reliable management while extending the life of the sewer pipes for decades to come.
